

## OFSTED says

*Abstract from The Times 06 Dec 2005. By Tony Halpin, Education Editor*

Ofsted highlighted inadequate supervision, poorly trained staff and a lack of security as a succession of parents arrived and departed.

"In too many nurseries there are not enough staff on duty at the start of the day to offer good care for children: this was found consistently in one fifth of the nurseries visited," Ofsted said.

"In a third of nurseries visited, the first hour or more of care lacked sufficient planning to support the needs of all the children attending. In particular, security was weak, allowing adults to enter the nursery unchallenged."

They found that all of the nurseries visited had good security systems "in theory", but that some overrode procedures during busy periods. Three nurseries were criticised for "unacceptably" allowing inspectors to enter without challenge.


# Proximity & Biometric Access Control System

Registered staff and parents can gain entry automatically after being verified using either a card or fingerprint reader located at the entrance. Both systems come with a complete user access log.

## More about fingerprint reader systems

Fingerprint identification is the most secure form of access control. The chances of two people having the same fingerprint is 1 in 64 billion - and because there are no pass cards or security numbers involved, the system is the easiest to use and maintain on an ongoing basis.

Individual fingerprints are stored in the system as a mathematical algorithm (rather than as a readable image) ensuring individual privacy is protected whilst making it virtually impossible to cheat the system.

The good news for nurseries is that although this was once 'sci-fi' technology, it has now become widely used by many businesses. As a result, the cost is no longer prohibitive, particularly when the additional convenience and lack of ongoing support costs are considered.

## Audiophone & Videophone Door Entry System

These systems are popular as an entry-level door access control. A visitor would press a button on the front panel to buzz the handset in the nursery. A member of staff then lifts the receiver on the handset to speak to the visitor and then presses the release button on the handset to open the door. A videophone system would allow the staff member to see who is at the door too.

These systems also compliment the proximity and fingerprint systems for controlling access of visitors who are not registered card holders.


